

# Regulations for the Use of Student Lockers

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## Master's Degree Programme in Medicine and Surgery

### Article 1. Purpose and scope

These regulations govern the procedures for using the lockers made available to students regularly enrolled in Medical Area degree programmes who attend clinical clerkship activities.

The lockers, numbering more than 650, are intended for the temporary storage of students' personal belongings before the start of clinical clerkship activities, in order to ensure order, safety, and appropriate hygiene and health conditions in healthcare settings.

The lockers are located in all buildings where wards hosting tutoring and clinical clerkship activities are present, so as to ensure widespread and functional access for students.

### Article 2. Eligible users

The lockers are intended for students regularly enrolled in Medical Area degree programmes who attend professional training and clinical clerkship activities at the facilities.

### Article 3. Use and access procedures

All lockers are equipped with a key.

The lockers may be used exclusively for the temporary storage of personal belongings during daily clinical clerkship activities.

In view of student rotation in professional training activities, permanent assignment or individual appropriation of lockers is not permitted.

### Article 4. Student obligations

The student is required to:

Use the locker only for the time strictly necessary for daily activities;

Completely empty the locker at the end of each day;

Place the key inside the locker after use, making it available to other users;

Keep the locker tidy and clean.

### Article 5. Permitted use

Lockers must be used exclusively for the storage of personal belongings connected with teaching and clinical clerkship activities.

It is prohibited to:

Deposit dangerous, flammable, or illegal materials;

Store perishable goods;

Use the locker for purposes that are incompatible with the activities of the degree programme.

The student is responsible for the proper use of the locker during the period of use.

### Article 6. Liability

The University and/or the University Hospital are not liable for any theft, loss, or damage to items stored in the lockers.

The student is responsible for any damage caused to the locker structure or locking system.

### Article 7. Inspections and extraordinary opening

For organisational, safety, or maintenance needs, the Administration reserves the right to open the lockers, including without prior notice.

## **Article 8. Violations**

Failure to comply with these regulations may result in:

Temporary prohibition from using the lockers;

Further measures in accordance with the regulations in force.

## **Article 9. Final provisions**

Use of the lockers implies full acceptance of these regulations.
